



**Lim Tit Meng, Associate Professor
Chief Executive
Science Centre Singapore**

Associate Professor (A/P) Lim Tit Meng has been Chief Executive at the Science Centre Singapore (SCS) since January 2010.

A/P Lim graduated with a doctorate from the University of Cambridge in UK in 1987, and holds a BSc (Hons 1) from National University of Singapore (NUS).

A/P Lim served on the Science Centre Board from 2006 - 2007 and prior to his current role, was Assistant Chief Executive at Science Centre Singapore (SCS) for two years, presiding over the Education Programme division.

A noted figure in the science academic field in Singapore, A/P Lim concurrently holds the position of Associate Professor at NUS Department of Biological Sciences. He has held many leadership positions at NUS, including that of Vice Dean from 2003 to 2008. A/P Lim's scientific background includes Zoology and Life Sciences, and his current research focuses on cell death mechanism involved in Parkinson's disease and Acute Myeloid Leukaemia. He is continuing with his research programmes whilst serving as Chief Executive of Science Centre Singapore.

The past President of the Singapore Institute of Biology, A/P Lim currently co-chairs the 2012 International Biology Olympiad Committee in Singapore.

A/P Lim is a major contributor to science education on a national level, playing an active role in shaping the biology curriculum in particular. He has received numerous teaching-related awards, including seven Teaching Excellence Awards from the NUS Faculty of Science. In 2008, he received the Outstanding Contributorship Award for the MOE Science Research Programme, for his services in the years 1988-2007.
